FOREWORD

The success of the Broadway Arts Festival in 2021, despite the Covid pandemic, has confirmed the sustainability of the charity's artistic aims. Over the last five years the Festival programme has steadily grown in conjunction with an ever wider and more diverse audience.



expand the scale of our charitable aims which are focussed on awarding bursaries to students studying the arts and offering an arts outreach programme to primary and secondary schools.

The schools' outreach programme thrived in 2022 as we expanded the offering to local secondary schools. 2023 will see a further increase in the schools' programme.

Our annual student bursary scheme has seen a significant increase in the total value of grants awarded. In 2021 we awarded \pounds 24,200 to 17 students and in 2022 we awarded \pounds 23,500 to 10 students. In both years there was a wide range of courses being followed at universities throughout the UK. We showcased the work of our 2021 bursary winners at an event held in September with many of our students being able to participate. We will continue to offer a platform to our bursary winners to demonstrate their talents.

Finally, on behalf of the Trustees, I would like to thank our benefactors whose generosity helps fund our charitable objectives, our sponsors who support our artistic aims and the Management Committee who have worked tirelessly to stage the 2023 Festival.
